Scout Law of the Month

Talk about what the scout law means with your child.

Clean

To be clean means to be presentable, to be well-groomed, and to have good personal hygiene. Scouts should always remember that they are representing scouting to others and should wear their uniforms with pride at events. To be clean also means to clean up after meetings and events. Lastly, scouts being clean refers to being moral and trying to always do what is right.

Reverent

To be reverent means to show respect, whether it be showing respect at an important event or showing respect to an authority figure, like a parent, a member of the clergy, or a public official. During prayers, scouts should show reverence. Scouts also should show reverence for others' beliefs and particularly their right in a free society to have different beliefs. Finally, as scouting promotes conservation, scouts should show reverence for nature, animals, and the environment.
